We have also been increasing our reach and services steadily over the year with further consolidation and strengthening of our activities in Ramingining and other Indigenous communities.

Across the Territory, in Katherine, Alice Springs and Darwin, carers are receiving benefits of our increased focus on broadening and deepening our services. With the introduction of the NDIS, we have focussed on how we will remain at the forefront of supporting Northern Territory carers and I welcome our NDIS registration as a service provider, and the increasing range of our services under this registration.

Our administrative staff and functions were moved to Harry's Place earlier this year. This move has provided a strengthened opportunity for collaboration with our partners, in particular, Carpentaria. Being located at Harry's Place means that we have stronger connections for operational efficiencies with our partners. We can also provide easier access for the majority of Darwin residents living in the northern suburbs.

Carers NT has been working in close collaboration with other carer organisations across Australia towards developing an even stronger network. This includes ensuring that the work of Carers Australia is focused on carers in the Northern Territory and working closely with us as partners.

The work of Carers NT would not be possible without the dedication and commitment of our professional staff and our partners. In particular, we recognise the significant contribution that carers make to the Territory. We remain resolute in our commitment to advocating and providing the best possible services for carers in this rapidly changing landscape.

## FROM THE CEO

It is my great pleasure to welcome you to the Carers NT 2018 - 2019 Annual Report.

This year we achieved tremendous results and faced many challenges. We undertook a range of program reviews in preparation for the changing landscape of the National Disability Insurance Scheme, and the soon to be rolled out, Integrated Carer Support Services (ICSS) which will see Commonwealth Carelink and Respite Centres replaced with fewer ICSS providers servicing much larger regions. Whilst it is recognised these changes are essential to meet the future needs of the sector, it must also be acknowledged that the challenges and impact for staff were significant. At the time of writing this report, Carers NT is preparing to become the new ICSS provider organisation across the entire Northern Territory for the next five years. This is an important milestone achievement for the organisation and I thank all of the team involved in the preparation and submission of this important tender.

Leading an organisation through change can be complex, however, it is made less so when surrounded by a supportive Board and positive visionary leaders. I have the greatest admiration for our staff and carers who throughout the year remained unwavering in their commitment to the work they do and stood stoic in the face of uncertainty.

I am proud to report in our 2018 - 2019 Carers NT Annual Report that we have now extended our reach across the East Arnhem region of the Top End. Carers NT officially opened of the Lungurrma Community Services Hub in Ramingining on 7 November 2018. We held a large community event on the day and the Honourable Warren Snowden MLA did the honours of officiating the opening. Through this important initiative, we are now able provide increased support to more remote indigenous communities than ever before.

Moving forward, I am greatly encouraged by Carers NT's aspirations for the future; a future that inspires and develops leaders at all levels of capacity, builds on a culture of learning and acceptance, allows for mistakes and places a greater focus on the application of our learnings for the benefit of our clients and the communities that we work within.

This year's Carers NT Annual Report truly reflects the incredible work undertaken by staff across our expanded footprint, working in line with our strategic direction, values and vision.

I continue to be inspired by the courage and determination of those we support, their journeys and the challenges they face in pursuit of a positive future.

Carers NT, The Arnhem Land **Progress Aboriginal Corporation** and Bulungkanum worked together to establish a new service Hub which will provide aged care and disability services and support the roll out of the NDIS.

## Move to Harry's Place

Carers NT's Darwin office moved to Harry's Place in Tiwi, a shared community space specifically designed for a range of organisations offering related services in the community services, allied health and disability sector.



## Joined the SANE Australia network for online peer support.

SANE Forums were integrated into the Carers NT website to offer a safe and anonymous online space for individuals, families, friends and carers with mental health concerns to connect and share experiences. The network enables people who are geographically or socially isolated to become part of a welcoming and caring peer support community.

Following a registration and accreditation process, Carers NT started delivering Support Coordination Services under the NDIS.

New buses keep carers on the move

Carers NT unveiled two new 12 seater buses for the organisation secured through a major grant from the NT **Government Community** Benefit Fund. The buses provide vital transportation for Carers NT's clients in the Darwin and Katherine regions.





## **NOW A REGISTERED NDIS** PROVIDER OFFERING SUPPORT **COORDINATION SERVICES.**

With the advent of becoming a Registered NDIS Provider, Carers NT started providing services to participants registered with the NDIS in May 2019.

Having first invested time in getting our staff members trained and our systems to be NDIS ready, we then undertook a process of market analysis and stakeholder consultations to determine where service gaps existed and to determine how Carers NT could best meet client needs the most. Once completed, it was then decided that the areas where we would concentrate on first were the provision of Coordination of Support (COS) and Short-Term Accommodation (STA) services.

Coordination of Support (COS) is a service area which involves us helping NDIS participants to access provider services and to meet the stated goals of their NDIS plans. Short Term Accommodation (STA) involves Carers NT supporting NDIS participants to access suitable accommodation facilities for short-stay and/or respite purposes.

At present we are delivering NDIS services in Darwin and Alice Springs, but are planning to expand our NDIS service capabilities across our entire operational footprint during 2020.

## **NEW SERVICE HUB IN RAMINGINING**

Carers NT, The Arnhem Land Progress Aboriginal Corporation and East Arnhem Traditional Owners officially opened a new community services facility in Ramingining in November 2018.

The Lungurrma Ramingining Community Services Hub provides aged care and disability services and supports the roll out of the NDIS in remote areas, an innovative approach which will assist remote and very remote locations in the NT and possibly other jurisdictions.

The development of the centre is seen as a positive step in creating employment and capacity in the remote community.

Carers NT is very proud to work along side the Traditional Owners and community to establish services that meet the needs of Ramingining. The centre will enhance the range of services we are able to offer in the community, provide local employment and enable us to explore other opportunities to increase culturally appropriate supports for carers, persons of age, individuals living with disability and other Ramingining community members.

Carers NT has provided respite care in Ramingining for close to 18 years but until recently had not established an ongoing on the ground service. In February 2019, two large consultation rooms were added to the Lungurrma Hub complex to enable a range of allied health related services to also be delivered onsite. The establishment of the new centre will enable Carers NT to better assess the needs and interests of families living in the remote community.



## THANK YOU TO OUR WONDERFUL, VALUABLE VOLUNTEERS

From its inception in February 2004, the Carers NT Volunteer, Community Support, Advocacy and Information Program was recognised as a vital support to people with disability who required assistance to access the community.


With the roll out of the National Disability Insurance Scheme and the funding being transferred into that scheme the Volunteer Program ceased after more than 15 years on the 30 June 2019.

Carers NT is incredibly grateful for the support provided by the volunteers over these years and will continue to enjoy their support for organisational activities such as events and community engagement. We hope to establish a non-funded program to continue with this vital support during the 2019 - 2020. Thank you.


## **YOUNG CARERS**

With an estimated 272,000 young carers in Australia, aged up to 25, including 78,000 young Australian carers under the age of 15, Carers NT recognises the challenges faced by many young people trying to juggle education, employment, duties at home and caring for their loved ones. Carers NT's Young Carers program supports carers aged 5 to 25 through a range of school holiday programs to enable them to connect with their peers, advice, counselling and respite options.

## **NORTHERN TERRITORY YOUNG ACHIEVERS AWARDS 2019**

Young carers were recognised at the Territory's 2018 Young Achiever Awards in Youth Week for the contribution they make towards their families and the community.

Carers NT is incredibly proud to work with three of the young finalists who demonstrated a maturity and dedication to their family members way beyond their years. Not only providing unpaid care for their family members, they have also continued to participate in community activities and advocate for other young carers.

#### The 2018 Young Carers finalists:

- Davida Norris, 19, cares for her younger brother who has severe physical and developmental disability. Davida supports him with all activities of daily living including personal care, transport, communication and access to healthcare. Davida is active in her community as an advocate for young carers and people with disability.
- Eloy Mason, 16, provides up to 30 hours of care a week for his autistic brother. Due to Eloy's care, his brother enjoys a wide range of experiences and continually learns new skills. Eloy supports him to participate in a diverse range of activities including sport, drama and community performances. Eloy actively advocates understanding and acceptance of those with intellectual disabilities.
- Emma Symonds, aged 12, cares for her three brothers who have Autism Spectrum Disorder. Emma participates in activities with the Carers NT – Young Carer Program.






## **CARER SUPPORT ACTIVITIES**



Carers have reported that they feel empowered when participating in educational workshops, information sessions and respite activities which enhances their capacity to make choices and transform those choices into desired actions and outcomes.



## **MENTAL HEALTH FIRST AID**

Each year one in five Australians will experience a mental illness. Unfortunately, many people are not knowledgeable or confident in how to offer assistance. While physical first aid training is accepted and widespread in our community, most training does not cover mental health problems.

Mental Health First Aid (MHFA) teaches people the skills to help someone who they're concerned about and provide early intervention and lifesaving skills. Across the 2018/2019 year Carers NT provided free MHFA training sessions to carers which assisted them to develop the necessary skills to intervene and assist in both crisis and noncrisis situations. Carers were then provided with an opportunity to become accredited in MHFA.
