MESSAGE FROM OUR



Welcome to 2023 everyone and what a busy year we had in 2022!

I hope you and your loved ones had a lovely Christmas and New Year. I acknowledge that being a carer does not always allow for a rest or a holiday! But I hope it was an enjoyable period.

Carers NT has certainly grown in the variety of services we offer to our carers. I believe we are well on track to meeting our Carers NT Vision and Mission statements.

Our Vision is to have a community in which carers are recognised and valued as a significant asset in which they have access to timely and appropriate services.

Our Mission is to enhance the quality of life for our client groups and the wider community in the NT by providing appropriate services including:

- Quality service delivery
- Community development, education, information and awareness
- Advocacy
- Involvement in public policy formulation as it relates to carers

A few highlights as follows:

The year has commenced with a busy beginning, our Nhulunbuy service is in high demand. With the high number of people requiring our services in a remote region also comes with requiring extra staff and accommodation for them. We are in the process of purchasing another property to meet that need.



Carers NT has been in discussions with the Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade and has been approved as an employer for the Pacific Australia Labour Mobility (PALM) scheme. Carers NT is the first Aged Care/Disability services provider to be approved under PALM for Timor Leste which will assist greatly in addressing a skills shortage.

Our Nhulunbuy service continues to grow and other service provider partnerships are invaluable. I am pleased to report that Carers NT are in discussions with Gumatj Aboriginal Corporation about the possibility of partnering to maximise the best outcomes for our client groups.

Our centre-based aged care respite services in both Darwin and Ramingining are quite stable and well-attended.

Carer support groups in both our Darwin and Humpty Doo office are well attended and very well received by the carers who come along. These groups provide ideas and support to carers to maintain and encourage their caring journey, and most importantly, to look after the carers themselves.

Carers NT also provides centre-based aged care, Flexible Respite Services and Cottage Respite. Cottage respite is providing overnight respite for a loved one to allow the carer to have a much-needed break. Residential aged care facilities are harder to access for respite. This alternative model has helped fill the gap and provide that much-needed service.

Her Honour Vicki O'Halloran AO, has completed her term and has officially departed from her office at Government House. Her Honour was our patron for Carers NT and provided interest and support to us. On behalf of Carers NT, I would like to thank Her Honour and acknowledge her support and attendance for officiating our openings of Djäka'mi in Nhulunbuy, our Humpty Doo office and our Sanderling House to name a few. All the very best Vicki.

We would also like to welcome The Honourable His Honour Professor Hugh Heggie PSM, as the new Administrator of the Northern Territory. He brings extensive experience, commitment to community service, and a deep understanding of senior public service, executive leadership and statutory roles. NHULUNBUY SIL HOME OFFICIALLY OPENS

Djäka'mi is a Yolngu word which literally means to care. It is the name bestowed upon Carers NT's supported independent living (SIL) home in Nhulunbuy, as explained by Rirratjingu clan elder, Witiyana Marika, at last year's July opening.

Djäka'mi provides round the clock care to NDIS participants and also provides respite for aged care and NDIS clients. It is the first of its kind in remote Australia, providing culturally appropriate care.

While Djäka'mi has been operating since 2020, Covid thwarted plans to stage the official opening until 14th July 2022. Our patron, Her Honour the Honourable Vicki O'Halloran AO, the Administrator of the Northern Territory, noted during her speech, "This centre is so important for clients and the wider community. We know that there is a direct link to improved health and wellbeing outcomes when people can remain on country and connected to country - to family, to language and culture."

Carers NT employs around 30 staff in Nhulunbuy to operate Djäka'mi as well as an office in the town with Tom Poutu, our very capable services manager at the helm. In providing a much-needed service, Carers NT in the East Arnhem region also makes a significant contribution to the local (and Territory) economy through the employment of locals and its spending on services and consumables.

Demand for services continues to grow and Carers NT and its Board of Directors are tackling head-on the challenges of expanding services into remote and regional areas. The logistics and costs of doing business and delivering services in remote locations in the Territory are all too well known!



THE WONDERFUL & TALENTED

Rosie was born in 1990 in the remote township of Nhulunbuy. As the middle child of 5, Rosie is adored by her parents Tony and Janice and very much cherished by her 4 siblings. Rosie is described as a sensitive, caring and family-orientated young lady.

"I called her my angel child," explains Janice (mum), who knew from the moment she was born, that something was unique about Rosie.

Rose Lumanytjinga Yunupingu is a 32-year-old Yolngu lady, born with Down Syndrome.



Despite the challenges she has faced, Rose or Rosie as she prefers, has shown that with the right supports, love and connection, people with disabilities can lead fulfilling lives and contribute to their communities in meaningful ways.

Growing up in a remote community, Rosie faced many challenges due to her disability. At times, due to a lack of awareness and understanding, Rosie was marginalized and faced social stigma; However, Rosie's family recognised her positive attributes and provided her with the supports and encouragement she needed to thrive.

For the majority of Rosie's upbringing, Rosie travelled extensively between Darwin, Adelaide and Melbourne in order to receive the medical supports she required. Janice recalls the intensity of travelling to the big cities for the first time with her new baby, only to be told by specialists "she would never dance or walk." With a strong commitment to culture, dance and ceremony, Rosie proved everyone wrong as she learnt to dance and sing in front of her family at church.

As Rosie developed into a young lady and her parents continued in their work, the decision was made to explore suitable independent living options for her. In 2021, the decision was made that Rosie would move into Djäka'mi – Carers NT's Supported Independent Living home in Nhulunbuy. This living arrangement has allowed Rosie to build on her independence and self-determination, whilst remaining connected to her family and culture.

Rosie's story is a testament to the power of culture and connection to community and the importance of inclusion. Despite the challenges she has faced, Rosie has shown that with the appropriate supports in place, individuals with a disability can overcome obstacles and lead fulfilling lives.











CARERS NT **30TH ANNIVERSARY**

Carers NT commenced providing services to carers on the 17th of December 1992, and during the past 30 years, the organisation has grown immensely, with almost 90 employees across Darwin, Humpty Doo, Katherine, Alice Springs, Nhulunbuy and Ramingining.

SUE'S STORY

We recently had the opportunity to sit and chat with Sue and her husband David who she's been caring for since 2012. It was certainly an insightful experience for us as these conversations give us an understanding of the individual needs of carers, helping us support them more efficaciously.

Sue and David have been married for 56 years and moved to the Northern Territory from Grafton 22 years ago. When asked how many children they have, Sue joked, "Two boys, and David!".

David was captain of the Darwin River Brigade for 9 years before he developed issues with his lungs. He suffered from lead poisoning due to an unfortunate incident and was also diagnosed with a disease that imitates TB. His condition deteriorated to the extent that he had trouble breathing normally. In another serious accident with a tractor, he injured his leg, leaving him unable to walk and in constant pain. Unable to do anything on his own, David's doctor advised Sue to give up her job because her husband needed full-time care. It completely turned Sue's life around. When asked what the most difficult part was, she said, "He went from being really active, to eventually having to use a wheelchair and requiring assistance for daily tasks". She also added that a major part of their frustration was that they can't fly outside of Darwin because of David's leg injury. Caring for David is a full-time job for Sue.

We were glad to hear that she was very happy with some of the supports she's received through Carers NT and Carer Gateway. Sue said she loves attending the regular peer support groups we hold, as interacting with other carers who are in the same position as she is, really helps her. When she gets a little free time from her caring role, she enjoys drawing, reading, writing, doing some woodwork and lots of embroidery.

Her love for art and craft brought her to one of our art therapy workshops which she thoroughly enjoyed and has asked us to hold more. David is quite fond of the day respite we have in Humpty Doo which gives Sue the chance to spend some time doing the things she loves. Sue was also really appreciative of the spring cleaning service that we were able to put in place for them.

Sue's carer role is crucial for her husband but is also a lot of work for her. People like Sue are our inspiration, and motivate us to go above and beyond in doing what we do. She really is a true hero.
